The required texts must be brought to all classes. You are expected to have read any rules or statute sections in the Selected Standards to which the problems or readings in the Casebook refer. The Supplement includes cases and state bar ethics opinions to be read for class. It will be available on during the first week of class, in the Business Office. On the first class day, I will discuss other study materials to help you with the course material.

II. **COURSE SCHEDULE**. Please note that class coverage of reading assignments is fluid, i.e., we will not always cover all of the assigned material during the scheduled class periods. Often, we will carry over the assignments to the next week, particularly at the beginning of the semester. It is your responsibility to keep track of how far we have gone in the previous class and make sure you are prepared. You will not be excused from being prepared because you read the case two weeks before and “don’t remember” it. I expect you to be prepared on the first day of class; at a minimum, you must have prepared an issue statement for each assigned case in the Supplement.² Please note that the syllabus and full reading schedule, as well as a supplement of additional cases we will cover during the semester, will be available during the first week of class.
