 Career Outcomes	Designed to propel professionals into compliance roles across hospitals, insurance, pharmaceutical/device firms, eldercare, and multiple government agencies like FDA, OSHA, FTC, DOJ, CMS.	Leads to a license to practice law—options include litigation, law firms, in-house counsel, government legal service, and judiciary.
